She has a BS in Retail Merchandising and Management with a minor in Business Administration from the University of Wisconsin – Stout. Her background includes marketing, graphic design, community outreach, and business development. She is a former Learn to Skate and figure skating coach for the United States Figure Skating Association (USFSA), a mom to three kids, and helps her husband flip houses on the side.

In November, 2021, Wittman was named one of "Wisconsin's 34 Most Influential Asian American Leaders" by Madison365 as a result of her work in serving underrepresented and marginalized people. She has extensive experience serving on various board and committees including Waupaca County Tourism, Economic Development Committee for Appleton Downtown Inc., WI Main Street Alliance, Wolf River School to Work Board of Directors, and City of Clintonville Planning Commission. Wittman will start her new position on July 11, taking over for Nancy Smith who is retiring after 20 years as executive director.
