How Was STAR Created?



Opportunity Gap



- Black students experience the impact of systemic racism through invalidation and oppression in ways that other students do not.
- Students need equitable educational opportunities to thrive and reach their full potential.
- Providing access to these opportunities is critical to creating a sense of well-being for Black youth in the Fox Cities.
- Wisconsin currently ranks among the worst states in the country for racial equity.
- Discrimination in our economy, housing, criminal justice system, and schools continue to marginalize Black lives and diminish the Black community.
- The persistent racism experienced by Black families negatively impacts well-being, sense of self-empowerment, and limits opportunity.
- Black students are further impacted by inequities in suspension and expulsion, are less likely to graduate from high school, and are less likely to have the ability to access post-secondary education.
- Without the opportunities that come from learning and developing in a safe, inclusive, supportive, and engaging context, the Fox Cities community will perpetuate racial injustice.
- STAR is an initiative working to address marginalization by building equitable opportunity in education for Black Scholars.





AASD Graduation Rates









2021-2022 **Scholar Survey**




