New North convened a New North Broadband Alliance (NNBA) consisting of at least one Broadband Champion from each of the 15 regional participating counties (Brown, Calumet, Door, Florence, Fond du Lac, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marquette, Menominee, Oconto, Outagamie, Shawano, Sheboygan, and Waushara) and both Regional Plan Commissions (Bay Lakes, East Central Wisconsin). Kick-off meetings were held on April 6 & 11 (Attachment 1 – agenda, list of Broadband Champions).

Since the initial meeting, the NNBA has had five “office hours” to communicate updates, discuss plans moving forward, and provide a venue to meet/greet and share best practices between counties.

New North initiated contact with regional partners as soon as the PSC released county opt-in letters to ask if what each partner was planning to select. Fifteen of the eighteen counties we serve decided to approach the project regionally. Since then New North has participated in county-level broadband meetings. We, along with our local partners, helped to coordinate and participated in the Internet for All Listening Session in Appleton on May 19.

Currently, the NNBA has identified additional outreach to include the Regional Plan Commissions; collaborative outreach alongside PSC’s efforts via Boston Consulting Group; additional general public outreach via survey and social media; and Internet Service Providers (ISPs). Additional outreach may be coordinated as we move forward. Participating counties shared their progress in their individual county outlines (Attachment 2).

**Preliminary Regional Vision:** All residents in the New North region will have equitable access to affordable internet with a minimum of 100 Mbps down / 20 Mbps up speeds.

**Preliminary Regional Goals:** Overall goal is to best utilize planning grant funds to position each county and the entire region to be prepared to apply for various forthcoming grants to fund implementation. We will do this by:

- Ensuring collection of good data for local, regional and statewide Broadband planning
- Supporting the PSC and working with local Regional Plan Commissions to create maps to better visualize and communicate gaps
- Meeting with ISPs to share findings and figure the best path forward for each county/community

**Expand and enhance broadband access to all residents, educational entities, organizations and businesses in Brown County.**

**1. Local Ordinance/Policy**

1. Funding for:
  - a. Ontime funding for providers to install fiber or wireless service to EVERYONE (estimate \$140m for Brown County). Passing costs are prohibitive at least with current business models
  - b. Ongoing funding to subsidize the most rural/low population areas (the operational expenses outweigh the revenue).
  - c. Broadband Affordability (including devices/services)
  - d. Broadband education – small portions of the public needs help with digital literacy.
  - e. Staff to keep the projects moving (public or private but someone to keep it going).

Yes. 4,000 mailers with a survey and additional questionnaire relating to existing broadband and speed test were sent out. We have also had multiple conversations with stakeholders from the towns in the county. There are various stakeholders on the task force as well. Moving forward we plan on having informational meetings with municipalities to discuss broadband needs and issues.

**What are you hoping to accomplish with this planning effort?**

Collaborate with other counties in the New North region, sharing data, get more accurate representation of actual speeds in rural areas of the county.

Build on prior speed test data and planning efforts.

Identify localized areas to focus resources on to improve broadband.

**What are some key barriers related to internet for all in your community?**

Cost of middle mile infrastructure, and making the last connection to the residences.

Topography / line of site issues with cell tower broadband.

Large tracts of state owned property and large wetland areas create challenges when planning for broadband infrastructure.

Ensuring equitable access, with a focus on rural areas.

## Fond du Lac County

A county committee must be formed through a resolution approved by our County Board. A discussion is in process with the County Board Chairman as to the creation of a committee. The goal is to have the committee in place by the end of 2023.

**Have you begun outreach to stakeholders in your community related to broadband planning or can you provide a timeline of when and how you will outreach to stakeholders in your community?**

Our county is currently engaged in broadband fiber optic installation throughout the county with a 3<sup>rd</sup> party internet provider. Throughout this process various groups within the county have been part of the discussion as to the broadband needs within areas of the county, particularly the rural areas. Once a committee is created the intents would be to have the committee engage the community, including rural governmental bodies, school districts, corporations, etc. to assist in determining the areas of most need.

**Identify a preliminary county broadband vision and draft goals.**

Our county vision is to provide greater access to affordable internet by partnering with 3<sup>rd</sup> parties, such as Bug Tussel, in the installation of fiber optic lines throughout the county. Specifically, our goal is to ensure that many of our rural areas in the southern and western portions of our county, where the need is greatest, have access to affordable and high speed internet.

To assist in recognizing the areas of greatest need throughout the county.

**What are some key barriers related to internet for all in your community?**

Lack of fiber optic line installation in our rural areas, affordability, and availability of choice of providers.

The activities will be determined by the created committee which will focus on which activities, based on resources available, will best achieve the goal of increasing fiber optic line installations, affordability and providing our communities more access to a greater number of providers.

## Oconto County

**Have you convened an initial planning group or can you provide documentation of meetings of an existing group in your community?**

The County Board authorized the forming of a Broadband Taskforce through a resolution on May 18, 2023 ([Link](#)). The next steps are to recruit volunteers to serve on the committee based on the structure and to have them appointed and confirmed at the June 22, 2023 County Board meeting. An initial meeting should be held by July 30, 2023.

**Have you begun outreach to stakeholders in your community related to broadband planning or can you provide a timeline of when and how you will outreach to stakeholders in your community?**

Outreach to serve on the Broadband Taskforce will occur between May 18, 2023 and June 22, 2023. A structure outreach plan for stakeholder engagement needs to be developed by the taskforce, and will be part of the initial meetings of the group that will occur in July and August.

**What are you hoping to accomplish with this planning effort?**

To develop and share an understanding of broadband availability visually, and see how projects currently in progress fit together. There are grant related projects, RDOF projects, county projects and ISP activity that are taking in place in different areas without an idea of how they fit together. I also hope we can understand what the different needs are for getting broadband into homes---service access, affordability, or consumer knowledge/awareness.

**What are some key barriers related to internet for all in your community?**

Access to service at advertised speeds, availability in parts of the county where geographic features can create problems (heavily forested, hills, county or national forest land).

**What are some activities your community would like to undertake between now and July 1, 2024?**

Stakeholder outreach and engagement to identify barriers to broadband adoption, identifying existing broadband projects, supporting the development of maps that capture equity, access and deployment challenges, developing broadband related speed testing and surveys to guide future projects and priorities, and developing the vision of broadband service in Oconto County.



## Outagamie County

### Have you convened an initial planning group or can you provide documentation of meetings of an existing group in your community?

Outagamie County will convene an initial planning group meeting this summer (tentative: July 2023) to discuss existing broadband initiatives in the county and to gather feedback on initiatives and priorities. ### Have you begun outreach to stakeholders in your community related to broadband planning or can you provide a timeline of when and how you will outreach to stakeholders in your community?

Outagamie County has already begun outreach to stakeholders, including outreach to staff from various County Departments, internet service providers, our Town's Association, and our Town's Association Broadband Task Force.

### Identify a preliminary county broadband vision and draft goals.

Outagamie County does not have a local vision/goal(s); however, this may be determined following the initial planning group meeting we plan to hold this summer.

### What are you hoping to accomplish with this planning effort?

1. We would like to have a detailed plan outlining the steps and resources needed to ensure all residents and businesses in Outagamie County have access to reliable and affordable broadband. In particular, we would like the planning effort to result in:
  - An identification of the county sub-areas in greatest need. We are aware of existing projects in the works, but we know they will still leave gaps. (Note: existing projects include anticipated middle mile proposal with Bug Tussel and the RDOF-funded build out of fiber by Charter/Spectrum).
2. We would like to better understand what role the county could/should play in support of digital equity efforts.

3. We would like to better understand what the county's long-term role could/should entail (i.e., once we feel the county is fully served – or – is there an expectation that there will always be an active role for the County to play; is being “fully served” a moving target?).

**What are some key barriers related to internet for all in your community?**

- Lack of access to internet services
- High costs of service packages – especially those offering higher speeds
- Lack of knowledge about which service provider(s) serve their area (and navigating different service packages)

**What are some activities your community would like to undertake between now and July 1, 2024?**

- Participate in regional mapping – led by New North
- Send out speed test flyers
- Analyze regional mapping & speed test results. For each county:
  - Identify specific geographic areas that are unserved & underserved
  - Within these areas, determine number and type of HHs and Bsnses (consumer base), and barriers to serving these areas (e.g., lack of access to middle mile, enviro/topographical constraints, etc.)
  - Establish criteria and prioritize these areas by greatest need
- Create county-specific vision/goals by December 2023
- Host meetings for stakeholders including ISPs, elected officials, Broadband Taskforce, etc.

## Sheboygan County

### Have you convened an initial planning group or can you provide documentation of meetings of an existing group in your community?

Sheboygan County convened its ARPA Broadband Development Taskforce in August 2021. From August 2021 through January 2022, this group met several times to establish goals and develop recommendations for utilizing ARPA funding to expand access to broadband internet in Sheboygan County. Those recommendations resulted in the Sheboygan County Board of Supervisors allocating a portion of the County's ARPA funding to broadband at their June 2022 meeting. Since that time, the County's broadband champion has led mapping efforts to identify areas of greatest need for broadband expansion in the County. As that mapping project ends, it is anticipated that this Taskforce will reconvene in 2023 to review responses to a Request for Proposal (RFP) for broadband development that will be published in summer of 2023. Meeting minutes from 2021 are included ([Link](#))

### Have you begun outreach to stakeholders in your community related to broadband planning or can you provide a timeline of when and how you will outreach to stakeholders in your community?

In 2022, the County's broadband champion gave two broadband presentations to the Sheboygan County Heads of Local Government group, which is comprised of Town and Municipal leaders. Additionally, he attended several Town Board meetings to hear feedback about broadband challenges, as well as provide updates on the County's efforts to address this issue. It is anticipated that more of this outreach will occur in 2023 with the posting of the Request for Proposal (RFP) for broadband development in Sheboygan County.

### Identify a preliminary county broadband vision and draft goals.

Per the Sheboygan County ARPA Broadband Development Taskforce Charter: "(Develop Recommendations to) **Significantly Enhance Broadband Access, Affordability and Services Countywide**".

### What are you hoping to accomplish with this planning effort?

Information/data sharing with other New North Counties;  
Identification of potential collaboration opportunities;  
Input to regional planning effort.

### What are some key barriers related to internet for all in your community?

Low population density and challenging terrain in rural areas of the County greatly increases cost to deliver wireline broadband internet. Additionally, there are only a few wireline broadband providers in the County, which reduces competition and adversely impacts affordability of broadband in underserved areas. Lastly, incomplete maps and speed data lead to inaccurate conclusions regarding the number of unserved and underserved locations in the County.

Participate in regional mapping by providing our GIS data to New North;  
Create county-specific goals to inform decision-making on funding;  
Host meetings for County stakeholders including ISP's;  
Develop a Request for Proposal for broadband development in the County
